PVC Groundbreaker How-to

Supplies and Costs



- 10' 3/4" PVC-\$3-4 from home depot.
- 3/4" PVC elbows: 3 T's, 3 45's and 1 90-\$3 at most.
- A pool noodle-\$.50 when summers over, \$2.50 during summer

Step 1


Here we go. There is almost nothing to this prop. Only 2 easy steps. So.....

basically: take your PVC pipe and cut the following lengths:

2x 20"
4x 2"
2x 8"
2x 10"
1x 12"

so now assemble them..... as so.

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my bad, the 8s and 10s should be switched.

Step 2

Now for the pool noodle... cut it with a steak knife as so....

2x 8.5"

2 x5.5"

2x 5"

with the 5inch ones, split them the long way, but only one side...so don't go all the way through, just through one side. Then from the middle of that cut a 1" wide 2 inch long square so out so it will fit better over the shoulder. hard to describe, sorry.

the 5.5s are the upper arm, the 8.5s the lower arm. just slide them on.

There it is! quick and easy....just needs a costume now!

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
